

Please check your child's bag for letters and for homework.








Reading

Please try and read with your children every day. It does not have to take long, a couple of minutes is more than enough!

- The children start off on picture books to help their comprehension.
- So the start of their reading journey will include books that have no words.
- Ask them questions about the pictures and discuss what they can see!
- As they start to learn their sounds in phonics they will move up and receive books that have words in them according to their reading level.

READING DIARY

- Please make sure their Reading Diary is in their bag every day.
- When you have read with your child, sign the diary by leaving a comment (it can be something small such as 'Caleb read with mom ©').
- The children receive a bead to go into our reading jar when they
 have read, if you do not sign it they will not get a bead.
- We also do 'chocolate button' Thursday as a reward for the children who read at home.



Firm Foundations in Phonics 1

Our phonics journey will start off by developing vocabulary and distinguishing between sounds. This is called **Firm Foundations**.

Simple things like reading to your child and singing nursery rhymes to them will help their sound recognition!

Early Years Outcomes

C & L 22-36 months - Recognises and responds to many familiar sounds
