

Homework

This year, we are focussing on Reading and Spelling as our Homework activities.

Reading is at the centre of all our learning and it has an impact on everything your child does. We want our children to become confident and fluent readers and reading at home with your child is an expectation in supporting your child's education.

Daily reading should take place **every night**. Please read with your child for a short period each night (around 10 minutes), encouraging them to sound out unfamiliar words and read with fluency and expression and then take the opportunity to re-read the school reading book and ask questions to improve comprehension skills. Please make a comment in your child's reading record and return this with the reading book daily. Your child will have their reading book changed twice a week.

Spelling is an important part of the National Curriculum and there are many spelling rules that the children need to be able to apply to reach End of Year Expectations. Spelling words will be shared in class each week and sent home for the children as practice. Words will be tested the following week in class.



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Our Curriculum Focus this year will challenge the children to do 'All We Can' and, during the Autumn Term, they will be exploring the question, 'Who am I?' and learning about what the human body and mind needs to stay healthy. They will also be learning about inspirational people, who have achieved amazing things, such as Ellie Simmonds. We will also be exploring our local munity and the children will be researching local projects that they can become involved with to make a positive difference.

We will be supporting McMillan Cancer Support again this year by hosting a Cake Sale on Thursday 26th September. Families are encouraged to bake cakes at home and donate them to The children will be taking part in lots of fun challenges in class and a competition to see which class can raise the most money for this very worthwhile cause. Please look out for further details.

In Phonics this year, the children will begin by recapping and revising all the sounds they have learned in Reception and then from Christmas they will be taught the Phase 5 graphemes which include alternative spellings and pronunciations ready for the phonics screening which is compulsory at the end of Year 1.

In English this year, the children will be working hard to apply the phonics they have learned to write extended sentences using conjunctions to join two ideas. They will also be learning to use suffixes including 'ing', 'er', and 'est' as well as the prefix 'un'. The children will be encouraged to try to develop their writing by using a range of exciting adjectives also.

In Maths this year, the children will be learning to partition 2 digit numbers in to tens and ones, add and subtract 2 digit numbers, know their number bonds to 10 and then by the of the year number bonds to 20, count in 2s, 5s and 10s, know the value of different coins and be able to name 2D and 3D shapes and describe some of their properties.

Holly Hill's Christian values will continue to be at the heart of everything we do. This half term the children will be learning about friendship, kindness, love, hope, patience, respect and tolerance.
