# Superheroes



Our topic this term is Superheroes We will be learning some stories using Big Books. This will allow the children to apply their phonic knowledge in context and continue to develop their love for reading.

Phase 3 Sounds

In **phonics** the children will continue to learn the remaining Phase 3 phonemes and digraphs. Before moving onto Phase 4 where we will be learning consonant blends and clusters. We will continue to read and write captions and move towards simple sentences. The children will continue to practise reading and spelling the Phase 3 tricky words and learn the Phase 4 tricky words too. **Please continue to support us by** 



reading these at home every night.

In **Maths** we will be solving problems. We will be exploring numbers practically through doubling, halving and sharing. We will continue to add and

subtract, order and recognise numbers up to 20. We will be exploring capacity and become superhero's ourselves by solving maths problems to set the superheroes free. We will also be using time and money to complete different

challenges. We will learn how we can use money to buy things and how we can measure periods of time by counting, using timers and stop watches.

# Our Christian Values underpin all that we do. The children will be taught our values in the following ways this half term:

**Joy:** The children will learn through stories how Jesus gave joy to others by performing miracles. They will discuss the powers that Jesus had and how to some, he was a Superhero. The children will learn that joy is a feeling of inner happiness.

<u>Thankfulness:</u> The children will learn how to be thankful for our world. They will discuss all if the different ways we can show thanks and use them to make their world a better place.

<u>Respect:</u> The children will learn how to show respect to each other and to their environment. We will learn about the wider world and how we can look after it. Through stories we will learn how Jesus treated everybody with respect and how he taught others to be respectful.

**Tolerance:** The children will learn about acceptance and how to tolerate different feelings and beliefs. Through stories from the bible they will learn how Jesus showed tolerance and accepted everybody.

**Hope:** The children will learn about hope through stories and different activities. The children will hope for new plants to grow. During RE they will plant seeds and learn how to take care of them and help them to grow. This will help them to show respect for their world. They will learn about having hope when things are hard through the 'SuperTato' stories.

<u>Gentleness:</u> The children will use what they already know about gentleness to care for their environment and the world around them. They will continue to follow our golden rule "We are gentle." They will also be taught how it is important to be gentle when playing 'Superhero' games.
