



Uniform

On returning to school, **all** children will be expected to wear **full** uniform. Our school uniform consists of:



PURPLE: purple and white check dresses, polo shirts, sweatshirts/sweat cardigans with official logo

WHITE: shirts, blouses, polo shirts, socks, tights GREY: skirts, pinafore dresses, trousers, shorts, socks, tights BLACK: shoes

Children need to wear the appropriate clothing for PE. This is: A plain white T-shirt Plain black shorts (not Bermuda shorts) Black pumps/ trainers

You may also send joggers and a sweatshirt for outdoor PE when the weather gets cooler.

Could you please also ensure that **all** uniform items (including coats and P.E. kits) are labelled (as there are 232 children in school with the same clothes) This makes it a lot easier for us to return them to you if they go astray.

During PE days, can you please ensure that earrings and jewellery are removed to ensure the safety of your child.

At Holly Hill, we are working hard to instil a love of reading in all our children.

Reading promotes achievement in all subjects, not just English. Children who are good readers tend to achieve better across the curriculum.

As a school we would like you, as parents, to support this reading journey and take time each day to read with your child.

Why is reading so important?

Reading improves concentration. Children have to focus on the story when they are reading. If they read often, they will develop the skills to focus on longer activities.

Reading teaches children about the world around them. Through reading a variety of books children learn about people, places, and events outside of their own experience.

Reading improves vocabulary and language skills. Children learn new words as they read. They learn how to use words and other language features effectively in their writing and speaking.

Reading improves writing. As children read, they learn more about sentence structure, grammar and punctuation. They can use the new vocabulary that they learn in their own writing to make it more interesting and sophisticated.

Reading improves life chances and increases opportunities. It has been proven children who can read well go on to achieve higher GCSE results and continue to study at college and/ or university more often.

Ways you can support and help improve your child's reading:

□ All children need to read for at least 10-15 minutes every day. You can read other books that you may have at home, or from the library, in addition to school reading books.

 \Box Ask your child to read aloud to you, ask them questions about the text and use a dictionary to look up any words they don't understand.

 \square Speak to your child about the book they are reading and ask questions to check their understanding.

Encourage your child to re-read their school reading book several times during the week. This allows them to become more fluent as they begin to recognise more words as soon as they see them.

□ Model reading aloud to your child so they can hear fluent reading with lots of expression.

Ensure that your child's book is returned to school so it can be changed regularly.

All children should have a book bag. Please make sure that your child's book and book bag is in school everyday.





Learning in Year Two

Our Curriculum

In English the children will be focusing on writing descriptions making sure that they include interesting adjectives and: conjunctions (and, but, when, because, or, if, that, so). They will: also be writing short narratives.


In Phonics we will consolidating our Year One learning, for example, recognising alternate graphemes, before moving on to learning the Year 2 spelling rules. The children will also be learning to read and spell Year 2 common exception words.

In Maths we will be working on place value with numbers up to 100. We will start by writing the numerals up to one hundred and: then work on counting in steps of 2, 3, 5 and 10 forwards and back. As well as this we will be comparing numbers and learning how to partition them into tens and ones.


The children will also be learning the following subjects in our 'Who am I?' topic: Art, Computing, Design Technology, Geography, History, Music, PE, PSHE, RE and Science. Please see the Knowledge Organisers that follow which include the 'Big Questions' the children will be exploring and vocabulary that they will be using. It will be a great help to your child's learning and understanding if you can discuss and use some of these words at home, too.

Holly Hill's Christian values will continue to be at: the heart of everything we do. This half term the


children will be learning about kindness, tolerance, love, hope, patience, respect, and forgiveness.


