Our topic this term is Animals We will be learning some stories using Big Books. This will allow the children to apply their phonic knowledge in context and continue to develop their love for reading.

Phase 3 Sounds

In **phonics** the children will continue to learn the remaining Phase 3 phonemes before moving onto Phase 4 where we will be learning consonant blends and clusters. We will continue to read and write captions and simple sentences. The children will continue to practise the Phase 3 tricky words and learn the Phase 4 tricky words too.

Please continue to read these at home every night.



In **Maths** we will be solving problems. We will be exploring numbers practically through counting on

and back, doubling, halving and sharing. We will continue to add and subtract, order and recognise numbers to up 20. We will be exploring capacity and will

continue to name and describe 2D and 3D shapes. We will also be using time and money to complete different challenges. We will learn how we can use money in exchange for something and how we can measure periods of time by counting, using timers and stop watches.

Our Christian Values underpin all that we do. The children will be taught our values in the following ways this half term:

Joy: The children will learn through stories the joy that animals bring to our lives and how joy can be experienced in different ways

<u>Forgiveness:</u> The children will learn how it is better to forgive and that is a value that Jesus showed his friends.

<u>Kindness:</u> The children will learn how to be kind to animals when we visit the farm and care for our own butterflies. We will talk about how we can make the world kinder too.

Honesty: The children will learn how honesty is important in school and that when we tell the truth things are better than if we lie.

<u>Friendship:</u> The children will learn about Jesus' friends and how he cared for them. The children will look at how we form friendships with animals and we will talk about our friends that are not human.

<u>Patience:</u> The children will learn how patience is important when we care for our caterpillars and wait for them to turn into butterflies.

Love: We will learn about how we can love other creatures in our world and that it is our job to look after them.
