<u>Welcome to Year One Parents</u> Meeting

We would like to invite you into school on Monday 10th September at 9.00am to meet your child's class teacher and find out more about what your child will be

learning in Year One. The meeting will be held in the school hall.



We all hope that your child settles well into Year One. We understand that the transition from Reception to Year One can be a challenging time for some children but be assured we will do everything we can to ensure the children settle quickly. It can be a big change for some children adapting to the Key Stage One curriculum. To help them during the first half term children will still have access to play based activities in the afternoons and will have more structured lessons during the mornings where they will have opportunities to work independently as well as with an adult in a small group. This will ensure that staff can get to know children well and plan to meet their needs throughout the year.



In English the children will be focusing on writing lists and simple sentences using their phonics knowledge with finger spaces and correct punctuation. The children will be learning this through a range of exciting and engaging texts such as: Room on the Broom, Jack and the Beanstalk and Hansel and Gretel.

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In phonics the children will learning phase four of the Letters and Sounds document. In Phase four, no new graphemes (a letter or a group of letters that make one sound) are introduced. The main aim of this phase is to consolidate the children's knowledge of phase two and three as well as helping them learn to read and spell words which have adjacent consonants (where two consonants are next to each other in a word), such as **tr**ap, **st**ring and mi**lk**.

In Maths the children will be learning how to use numbers 0-20. They will be finding one more and one less than a given number, learning how to add and subtract these numbers as well as recognise which are odd and which are even. We will also be using our magic maths to recognise and use number bonds to 10.

Holly Hill's Christian values will continue to be at the heart of everything we do. This half term the children will be learning about friendship, kindness, love, hope, patience, respect and tolerance.
