# Under the Sea



Our topic this term is Under The Sea. This topic will have a focus on geography and science. The children will learn about different geographical features and animals that live under the sea. We will also be going on a trip to the Sea Life Centre to see many of the under water animals and learn more about their habitat.

In English children will be consolidating all their skills they have gained throughout the year. We will be focusing on their sentence structure and using this to form short narratives. They will also be continuing to use punctuation such as question marks and exclamation marks, as well as ensuring they can use the suffixes and prefixes such as un, ing, er and est in their writing.

In phonics the children will be having their phonics screening test where they are required to read real and alien words. The children have been practising doing this throughout the year and we have no doubt they will do well. To prepare the children for this we will be focusing on revising and consolidating all the sounds the children have been taught.

In Maths the children will be consolidating all their skills. We will be focusing on counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and using this understanding to solve multiplication and division problems. We will also be learning to estimate and measure time whilst practising for sports day. As well as this we will be measuring weight, length and capacity.



In RE we will be looking more at the story of creation from a range of faiths including; Christianity, Islam and Judaism, and how our beliefs help us to care for

our world.
