Uniform

Home Reading

Well done to all of the children who have brought in their new book bags already! It is vital that you read regularly with your child. Research shows

that children who read at home make better progress at school.

Books will be changed on a **Tuesday** and **Friday** every week. The first reading books will be given out on Friday 14th September. These will be simple picture books for you to share with your child. Please talk about what is happening, who the characters are, the characters feelings, what might happen next etc. to encourage your children to really immerse themselves in the story.

Could you please fill out the comments box in the reading record diary when you have read with your child as this will tell us that your child's book is ready to be changed.

We cannot change their reading book unless it has been written in. We will also be hearing your child read individually and in groups weekly.

Traditional Tales



Our topic this half term is Traditional Tales. The children will be introduced to a variety of fiction and non fiction texts this half term. We will be discussing where stories are set and describing the different characters. We will focus heavily on acting out these stories and telling these stories to our friends. We will also become story tellers ourselves and make changes to the traditional tales to create our own stories. Please have a go at making up your own stories based on a traditional tale. We will be encouraging the children to recognise rhyme, familiar words and repeated phrases so that they can begin to read some words on their own.

In **phonics** the children will begin to learn Phase 2 sounds. They will learn that 'phoneme' means the sound a letter makes and 'grapheme' means the written symbol. We will also be learning how to sound talk words to help us read and spell them. Please support your child with learning their sounds by looking for letters in



environment, identifying them in reading books, playing games such as I spy etc. Sheets will also be sent home to help your child form the letters correctly.

In **Maths** we will be practising our counting skills and helping the children to recognise numbers. We will also be learning about 2D shapes and patterns.

We also look forward to continue getting to know your child and will be encouraging the children to talk about their families and own experiences.

As a Christian school our vision is to promote 'Life in All its Fullness.' Our ethos is based on our 12 Christian values of hope, honesty, patience, joy, forgiveness, tolerance, thankfulness, respect, kindness, friendship, gentleness and love. We actively promote and explicitly teach these values and they underpin everything we do. The children will be taught our values in the following ways this half term:

Friendship - As we all come together and get to know one another we will accurately teach the children how to be good friends. We will learn how to be a good friend and what it feels like when others are good friends to us.

Kindness and Love – Children will learn ways that they can be kind to one another. We will teach children to consider their own actions and use puppets to explore what happens when others are not kind; considering how they can 'put things right'.

Patience — Children will learn to share resources and will learn to wait to take their turn.

Honesty and Forgiveness — Children will learn to say sorry and to be forgiven using the 4 step apology to resolve disagreements.

Respect — The children will be taught how to actively listen to each other and to adults and to show respect for each other's ideas, feelings and opinions. The children will also learn to show respect by looking after equipment and our environment.

Thankfulness – The children will learn that Christians sometimes say prayers to say 'Thank You' as part of their daily routine. We will also learn about Harvest and say Thank You for all of the things we have. We will collect tins and packaged food donations for our local foodbank for our Harvest
