# courageous Advocates

Our Curriculum Focus this year is challenging the children to do 'All We Can' and, this half term, they will be learning about the wider world.

They will begin to investigate the some of the plants and animals that live in different habitats, thinking about what it would be like to live there and what is needed to survive. The children will learn about how some of this wildlife is becoming endangered and the reasons for this and how we can help.

Our focus person is Sir David Attenborough who has dedicated his life to nature. Through studying him, the children will learn more about some of the places he has travelled to and be inspired by his They will be encouraged to think about what we can do both in school and at conservation work. home to make our world a better place and contribute to environmental initiatives such as recycling.

In English this half term, the children will continue to write for different purposes, such as recounts of real-life events. They will be encouraged to re-read their work carefully to check that it makes sense and will make simple additions or corrections to improve their writing.

In Reading, the children will focus on their understanding of what they have read. They will be asking and answering questions as they read and will discuss what has happened in a text, so far. They will be learning about the suffixes —ment, -ful, -less and —ly and looking for examples of words with these suffixes as they read.

In Maths this half term, the children will be working on identifying, describing and comparing 2D They will learn methods that they can use to solve multiplication and division problems. The children will also be learning to tell the time (quarter to, quarter past and 5 minute intervals).

In RE, the children will be exploring the question 'Why did Jesus tell parables?' and will be using art, drama and New Testament stories to find out more about Jesus' life and work and consider how Christians use these today.

Holly Hill's Christian values will continue to be at the heart of everything we do. This half term the children will be learning about friendship, kindness, tolerance, joy and love.
